

## Here's what we will work together to explore, understand, and be able to do in this unit:

- 1. Locate, label, and identify, on a regional map, the main physical, political, and man-made features of East Asia. (See cartography application activity = 'regional mapping' = for specific requirements)
- 2. Compare the major landforms of East Asia and describe the major climate zones and major natural resources of the region.
- 3. Analyze the factors that have influenced East Asian thought and describe the political systems of the region.
- 4. Identify and discuss the major languages and religions/philosophies of the region.
- 5. Explain how Chinese culture has influenced other parts of East Asia.
- 6. Describe how Chinese geography and history have contributed to the idea of it being a mysterious country to the Western world.
- 7. Identify factors that have affected standards of living in East Asia, as well as explaining how rapid population growth affects a developing country.
- 8. Describe the transportation networks of East Asia and explain the different degrees of government control over mass communication in the region.
- 9. Identify the problems that have resulted from East Asia's emergence as an exporting power and discuss the importance of maintaining good trade relations with other countries, particularly the US.
- 10. Discuss human rights as they pertain to China and Tibet.
- 11. Identify and explain the "critical issues" challenging the region of East Asia.
