This contingency will be available should any unforeseen issues be encountered during the course of construction.

DISCUSSION

**ISSUE:** Shall the Board review and discuss the draft 2015-16 Oak Park Unified School

District Local Control and Accountability Plan?

**BACKGROUND:** Effective in 2013-14, the existing K-12 finance system was replaced with the

new Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). As part of shift to LCFF, school districts and County Offices of Education are required to develop, adopt, and annually update a three-year Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), using a form adopted by the California State Board of Education (SBE). The LCAP identifies how districts and County Offices of Education address the State's priorities and metrics, and how expenditures are made in accordance with statutes. Following the process, requirements, and proposed schedule outlined for the Board at its January 2015 meeting, the draft 2015-16 Oak Park Unified School District LCAP has been developed with the input from diverse

groups of stakeholders.

The current draft of the 2015-16 LCAP will be posted on the District website after final editing. At this evening's meeting the Board will review and discuss the draft, and provide direction to staff in its preparation of a final draft for public comment. Education Code 52062 requires a public hearing to solicit the recommendations and comments of the public regarding the proposed LCAP. The public hearing has been scheduled for June 2, 2015. After receiving input from the public, the District's 2015-16 LCAP will be formally adopted at the

Board's June 16, 2015 meeting.
